A RESTORATIVE APPROACH

Character Creative embeds a 'restorative' framework throughout every course.

Restorative practices are about taking personal responsibility for our own actions. They demonstrate that by changing our actions, words and behaviour, we see change in the environment we live or work in.

Restorative Practices encourage people to follow steps of taking responsibility, valuing others, and repairing harm to support people to live restoratively.

Character Creative participants examine these steps and explore how restorative values can be implemented in their lives and the effect this would have on their own situations.

£8 in savings for every £1 spent on Restorative Justice

14% reduction in the frequency of reoffending after Restorative Justice

74% of offenders would recommend Restorative Justice to others

85% of crime victims who have been through Restorative Justice were satisfied with the process

78% of victims would recommend Restorative Justice to others

51% reduction in the frequency of suspensions in schools offering Restorative Justice

ART IS THE OVERFLOW OF EMOTION INTO ACTION

SAMPLE SAMPLE SESSION EACH SESSION IS DESIGNED TO BE FUN AND FULL OF VARIETY WHILE ALSO ENSURING THAT LEARNING OUTCOMES ARE ACHIEVED.

- Warm up games and exercises
- Create ground rules and ensure a safe space
- Rate yourself exploring where participants see their creative strengths and weaknesses
- Performance from artist and reviews from the crowd
- Movers and shakers artists who make most, artists who fake most and artists who create work that inspires most
- Live lounge covers and songwriting skills
- My story lyrics creating words to reflect participants' personal experiences
- Performance and celebration or work created in the day
- Re-rate yourself evaluate the session and re-rate skills
